#### Signing Ceremony on Sub-grant Agreements for CSO Partners

ActionAid Cambodia (AAC) and Transparency International Cambodia (TI Cambodia), on 12 August 2020, organised a signing ceremony on sul -gran agreements for CSO partners to implement 3-year strategic programmes (2020-2022). At this signing ceremony, ActionAid Cambodia (AAC) and Transparency International Cambodia signed sub-grant agreements with a total of 9 implementing partners who will contribute to different parts of the programme interventions.

TI Cambodia received the core fund from the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA) to implement the strategic programme on promoting transparency, integrity and accountability. As a contribution, Transparency International Cambodia and ActionAid Cambodia were also awarded the financial support from European Union to implement a 3-year project entitled, "Greater Young Women Empowerment in Decision Making and Accountable Public Service Delivery" in Phnom Penh and 9 provinces, starting from January 2020 to December 2022. The project budget is worth of EUR 2.2 million.

The objective of this project implementation is to create an enabling environment and empower youth, particularly young women, in Cambodia to effectively participate in decision-making processes to improve public service delivery, particularly gender-responsiveness, through innovative technology platforms and to engage in policy dialogue with key decision-makers and service delivery entities at local and national levels. One of the key interventions under this project is to provide sub-grants to local non-government organisation (NGOs), community-based organisations (CBOs), informal groups and media partners, given the fact that they are the key actors who would be able to reach out to a wider range of beneficiaries especially marginalised population in their respective geographical coverages.

As a result of the rigorous and transparent selection process, TI Cambodia & AAC have selected the 7 respectful partners; Cambodian Journalists Alliance (CamboJA), Politikoffee, Building Community Voices (BCV), Cambodian Civil Society Partnership (CCSP), Children and Women Development Center in Cambodia (CWDCC), Youth Council of Cambodia (YCC), and Thmeythmey to implement activities that contribute to the achievement of the project's expected outcomes.



Hong Reaksmey, Country Director of ActionAid Cambodia, said that this partnership will strengthen CSOs and media's efforts to build and improve young people's capacity and participation in monitoring of public service delivery at local level. As the core of the project interventions, youth will play a key role in working with local authorities and relevant stakeholders to enhance accountable and gender responsive public services. As media and CSOs will take a lead in building capacity of youth and enhancing their participation, we see the significance of CSOs' and media's contributions to the delivery of the project success.

**Pech Pisey,** Executive Director of TI Cambodia, said that collective action is always core of TI Cambodia's strategy. Working with relevant stakeholders, such as government, CSOs, media and business associations which bring different expertise and experience is crucial for the success of our work. TI Cambodia or ActionAid Cambodia alone would not be able to make the programme successful. We firmly believe that we are stronger and do better jobs when we cooperate and are well coordinated.



ActionAid Cambodia and Open Development Cambodia signed a MOU to implement the project at ActionAid Cambodia office.

Moreover, ActionAid Cambodia and Open Development Cambodia recently signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to implement the project "Securing access to and control over land and natural resources for vulnerable community fisheries in the coastal areas of Cambodia" under the support of the European Union in Cambodia (EU). ActionAid International is the lead applicant while Children and Women Development Center in Cambodia (CWDCC) and Cambodian Center for Human Rights (CCHR) are the co-applicants. The project aims to promote and improve equitable access to land and natural resources for vulnerable groups in Cambodia.

Through more effective political participation of the Community Fishery Networks and Human Rights Defenders who come from within the community, the action will enhance CSO contributions to governance and development processes and help them hold the government to account concerning the impact of commercial projects that are being planned in the coastal areas. The action responds to project by working with and for the Community Fisheries (CFi's) in Kampot and Kep provinces to promote land security and tenure.

This action comes at a critical time for CFi's in Kampot and Kep provinces, as plans for the New Kampot Town Development and French Riviera Marina projects – a project of Pallas Brilliant Investment and Development Co.,Ltd – get well underway. Part of an attempt to boost tourism in both provinces, the projects are also due to receive investments of USD 23.2 Bn.



#### ActionAid Cambodia to conclude 100,000 Mangrove Campaign

00,000 mangrove campaign finally has come to an end with a successful result. The number of mangroves planted in 8 CFi's has reached over the targeted number of 111,240 mangroves.

The campaign was initially launched in September 2019 and ended in August 2020. It is co-organized by ActionAid Cambodia (AAC), Children and Women Development Center in Cambodia (CWD-CC), Samaky Organization (SAMAKY), and 8 CFi's in Kampot Province including Trapeang Sangkea Community, Kampong Samaky Community, Trapeang Ropov Community, Prek Tnaot Community, Kep Thmey Community, Toteung Tngai Community, Koh Krasna Community, and Lok Community.

The 100,000 Mangrove Campaign aimed to mobilize public participation to support the eight CFi's in planting 100,000 mangrove trees, organizing mangrove planting events and other activities for community development.

Besides, the campaign also promoted the roles and essence of mangroves, the importance of protecting coastal areas to ensure food security for people and maintaining the balance of the ecosystem and the environment.

"Without our mangroves, we will lose our careers as fishermen, and we will not have any income to support our children's education. Also, this loss will result in many migrations and child's dropouts", said Ouk Neng, a Kampong Samaki media member.

**Sim Him,** a leader of Trapeang Sangkea CFi, emphasized that *"since we started to plant plenty of mangroves, biodiversity has increased dramatically; the number of fishermen also has rose, which leads to a drop in migration."* 

Mangroves not only play an essential part in community members' economy, but they are also a natural defence of some disasters. Mangroves significantly contribute to the survival of marine creatures such as crab, fish, and shrimp.



**Liv Chhim,** a Kep Thmey CFi leader, told that "mangroves are a natural defence of strong wind, which help protect our houses from destroying. Plus, they are habitats for marine creatures and help increase in fish species, which provides many benefits to people's livelihood."

Regarding mangrove benefits, **Thong Nhel**, a Trapeang Ropov CFi member mentioned that mangroves have strong roots which can help defend strong winds and landslides. Besides helping the community with natural resources regeneration, the 100,000 mangrove campaign also gather villagers to work together in scaling up and conserving the community's resources.



**Ouk Sovannarith**, a Prek Tnaot CFi leader, highlighted that *"100,000 Mangrove Campaign is vital because more people in the community have been aware of the importance of mangroves. Thus, they have come together to protect mangroves and all kinds of biodiversity."* 

Despite the end of mangrove campaign, the communities are committed to carry on their mangrove planting even without the support of organizations and their partners. According to **Kieu Sat**, a Koh Krasna CFi leader, he would continue planting mangroves with his committee and members who have practised in the past. He stressed, *"we won't easily give up our mangroves and resources we have been planting for years. We have to ensure that our resources will all remain the same."* 

**Hong Reaksmey,** ActionAid Ccambodia Country Director, proudly said "this campaign has increased 100,000 new mangroves on the coast of Kampot Province. Mangroves attract tourists and promote eco-tourism and green economy in Cambodia. The 100,000 mangroves were planted by people in eight CFi's in Kampot province and supporters. This is a true work of community solidarity. And I am very proud of that. Under the coordination of the Kampot Provincial Fishery Administration and all partner organizations, I really appreciate the leadership and participation of the eight community fisheries, people, students and young people who love the environment."

He lastly added that "please continue to plant, protect and conserve Cambodia's mangrove resources!"
